



Care tips for long-lasting roses

If you pay heed to the following tips, you will enjoy your roses for several days.



After longer transport, the stems must be cut (3-5 cm) because the air which has entered them hinders later water uptake.



Avoid direct sunlight and draughts.



Select a large vase. We recommend glass, china vases or varnished ceramics.

In order to avoid excessive oxygen in the water, fill the cool water into the vase "gently".

Avoid foliage leaves in the vase water.

TIP! If you put the vase in a cool room overnight, the roses' durability is increased.

If humidity is too high, individual petals can start to decay sooner than normal. Remove them immediately up to the receptacle in order to avoid the entire blossom becoming infected.

The vase and water must be clean and fresh in order to hinder algae and bacteria in the vascular tissue.

Dose the freshness retainer CHRYSAL more sparingly than it says on the package. Overdosage causes the foliage leaves to yellow.



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
